

VISIT TO STRAWBERRY HILL HOUSE AND GARDEN
268 Waldegrave Road, Twickenham TW1 4ST
2.30pm, Wednesday 1 July 2020



Strawberry Hill House is the Gothic Revival villa built by Horace Walpole (1717-1797) from 1749 onwards, pre-figuring the nineteenth century Gothic Revival. He had purchased the original building on the site to fulfil political pressure to establish a country seat, especially a family castle, which was a fashionable practice during the period.

Walpole had a very developed sense of style; the interiors are unique, designed as a bachelor home of taste in which to entertain his wide circle of friends during the summer months.

We have arranged a private tour of the house and its environs at 2.30pm. There is a lift to first floor, and toilets on ground floor. The house is on the ground and first floor. There are steps up to a turret room (Walpole's bedchamber & second bedroom) which does involve steps and no lift. After the tour we will have tea or coffee with a freshly-baked scone, jam and cream in the Garden Café, which is included in the cost.

The rail station at Strawberry Hill can be reached by the Teddington via Richmond train at Clapham Junction. There is an 8-10 minute walk from the station to the house. Free parking is also available outside the grounds.

The cost of this visit is £27.50, including the private tour and afternoon tea.

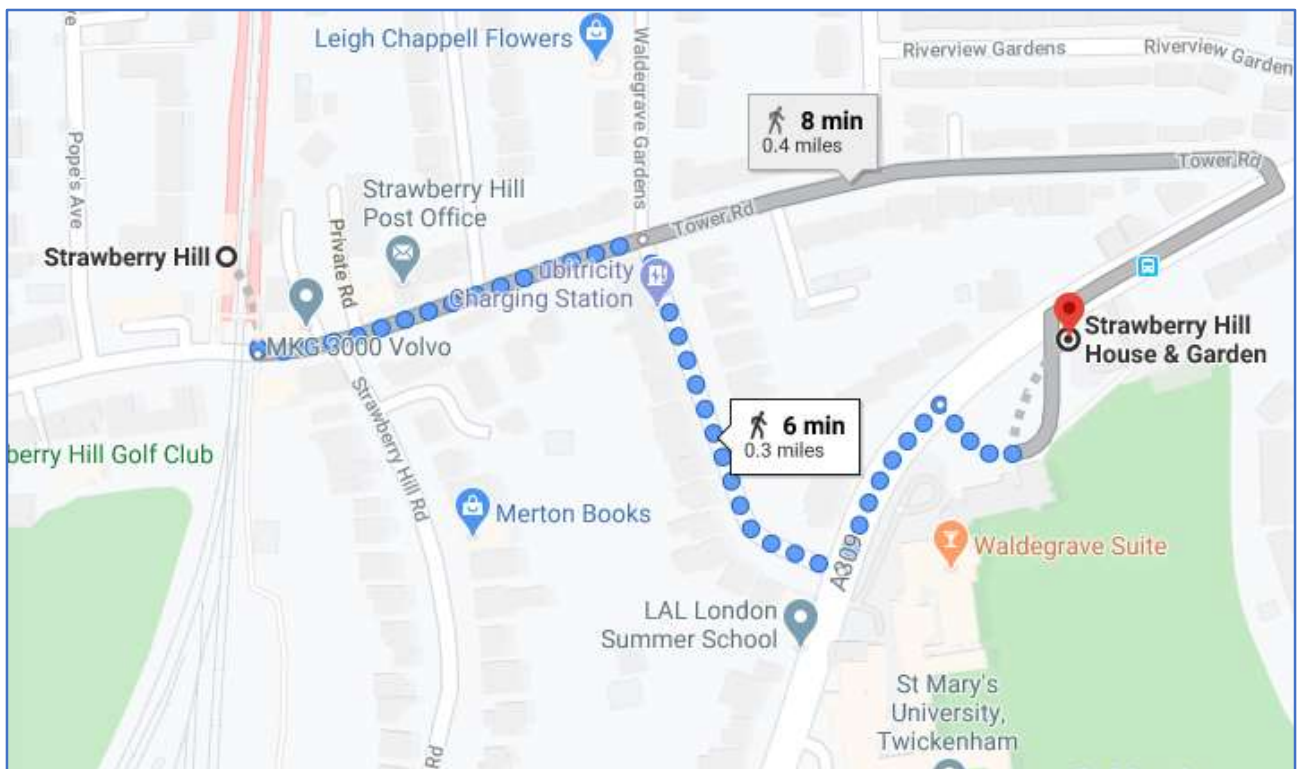
